12H30**Catherine Henderson - Audio Archivist & Media Librarian at CBC, Consulting Anarchivist at matralab**

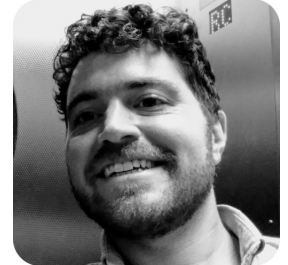
